Q: As we start Week 3, what are some of the things your students have been doing and learning in class and what's coming up in the near future?

A: "My third grade students are learning their times table beginning with the two and threes. They are also learning to regroup in addition, write and complete multiplication sentences, stories, facts, and solving problems.

In reading and language arts we began learning about cause and effect, author's purpose, main idea, figurative language, author's point of view, text features, and citing textual evidence. We will continue these skills along with working on vocabulary, reading comprehension, and fluency."
