Plantersville Enrichment Academy & 21st Century Afterschool Program

As part of our commitment to supporting students year-round, the Plantersville Enrichment Academy served 65 K-5 students, focusing on academic enrichment and tutoring to ensure their success. In partnership and support of the 21st Century community learning grant, we expand these efforts by providing a wide range of services, including youth development, service learning, health and wellness education, arts, technology, financial literacy, STEM, career training, and internships.

Plantersville Summer Academy & Summer Bridge

With a remarkable enrollment of 243 students, we've made a tremendous impact! This six-week academic course prepares K-9th grade students with certified teachers delivering the nationally acclaimed Bell Xcel curriculum. We focus on enhancing literacy and mathematics skills while providing hands-on science, technology, engineering, and math opportunities. This year, we celebrated a two-month gain in Math with improved test scores and a one-month gain in literacy based on our pre-and post-testing.

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Literacy Is for Everyone (LIFE)

LIFE has ignited a love for reading in Plantersville Community students, especially during the Summer Academy. With community-based programs, LIFE inspires students to embrace literacy, prepare for assessments, and foster a brighter future for all.

Village Flyers Bike Club

Join the excitement with the Village Flyers Bike Club, where youth connect with inspiring community members through thrilling bike rides! This dynamic mentorship program promotes movement, goal setting, and healthy living while fostering leadership skills and personal growth. As these young riders commit and participate, they develop lifelong habits and earn the incredible reward of cycling, empowering them to take charge of their futures.

Village Media

Led by MLNL Media, the new media program inspires scholars to explore their surroundings through the lens of a camera. This initiative empowers participants to capture Plantersville's unique culture, natural beauty, and historical heritage. Through workshops and field trips, students not only master technical photography skills but also weave powerful stories, deepening their appreciation for the community's vibrant identity and enduring values.

Village Group Youth Choir

Since its establishment under the patronage of Coretha Grate, Choir Director, the Youth Choir has grown to be a strong facilitator for youngsters to express themselves through music. Local appearances have also helped this choir nurture talent and bring families together in pride and unity.
